Classroom Courses

*Classroom-based courses are ideal for those who prefer group interaction and feedback during class from an AHA instructor. (Note: All AHA's written tests, whether they are required or optional, **must** be passed with an **84% or higher**.)*

eLearning Courses

eLearning courses offer the flexibility to complete the online portion (part 1) at the student's own pace at home or work. Completing part 1 online does not qualify the student to receive a CPR certification card. They must bring a certificate of completion (part 1), then complete part 2 with an instructor doing the skills practice and passing the skills test successfully.

IF, they don't pass the test on the Part 1- give them the written test first -then do the skills.
